### The Star Over Bethlehem

The unfolding of the story of the Incarnation continues today as the Church celebrates the Epiphany. The tale of the magi from the East is one of the most fascinating in all of scripture. It has much to teach us about what we can come to expect, even in circumstances and places that may seem insignificant or small. Bethlehem was a tiny town, what we might refer to today as a town without even one stop light. Yet it is over this seemingly insignificant place that the guiding star stops in its own search for the place where the Savior would be born. Too often we fail to recognize the fact that the star of Bethlehem comes to rest in our everyday lives, where we can experience God's presence, manifested in ever new ways.

Epiphany calls us to shake off our stupor and recognize the One who comes to save us.

# Winter Weather & Eucharistic Adoration

Winter weather sometimes interrupts regularly scheduled hours of adoration. Generally speaking, if local schools are closed, Adoration is closed that day. If there are winter weather advisories for the evening/night hours Adoration will be closed for those hours. As always, your shift coordinator will make every effort to call you to inform you of these changes. (Please make sure your contact information is correct and current!)

However, if you are not comfortable being out in the winter weather—for whatever reason— even if Adoration is not closed—then please stay home and stay safe. You need to judge your own ability to travel in the weather conditions and act accordingly.

If you have the phone number of the person who follows you in Adoration, call them to let them know you will not be coming in. If you are at Adoration and the next shift person does not arrive, please follow the directions for reposing the host, and feel free to leave. You do not need to stay until someone turns up! Directions are in the sign in book.

If you come in for Adoration and the host has been reposed, and no one else is there, follow the directions for returning the monstrance to the altar. The directions are in the sign in book.


