

## Pastor's Corner

## Lenten Series: Seven Deadly Sins-Seven Lively Virtues



Sixth Session: Gluttony - Asceticism. As we continue climbing Mt. Purgatory, we become more and more free of the heavy sins and encounter the lighter ones. This does not make them less deadly but it does mean that these sins involve "less grave" perversions of the good. Pride, envy, and anger are perverted loves which delight in harm to others. Sloth is defective love that fails to take an interest in the things of God. Gluttony, however, is an excess of love for created things, particular food and drink, over the love of God. It is lighter because the glutton at lease loves something. But it remains deadly because the love is not in right relationship to the love of God or the love of neighbor. We live in a culture of gluttony. Our culture makes it extremely easy to believe that "we deserve a break today," and we should continually indulge our appetites. Our faith does not call us to reject food and drink as bad things, but only use them within reason and, as ever, with respect for the common good and the love of God and others. As we look at the sin of gluttony and its antidote, asceticism, pay attention to ways

in which you may be tempted to excessive love of food and drink and also to models you have seen of people with a balanced and moderate approach to their appetites. Ask God for the grace to discipline your lower nature so that you can have the happiness you truly desire. (Seven Deadly Sins-Seven Lively Virtues, Barron, p. 19)

## **Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting System**

The new Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting (CBAR) service became operational Monday, March 15. The Bishops of the United States approved the national reporting system following Pope Francis' May 2019 apostolic letter, <u>Vos estis lux mundi</u> ("You are the light of the world"), to address the issue of sexual abuse and bishop accountability in the global Catholic Church.

CBAR is one way to report allegations, operated by Convercent, Inc., an independent, third party entity that provides intake services to private institutions for reports of sensitive topics such as sexual harassment, through a secure, confidential, and professional platform. Individuals may make a report by accessing ReportBishopAbuse.org or calling (800) 276-1562. Reports are taken 24 hours a day in English and Spanish. ## Children of the Light

The future king, David, in today's first reading, is an example of a type of character present throughout the Hebrew scriptures. He is the child born out of place (not the eldest or most favored) who ends up receiving the promise of the covenant. The spirit of God's anointing rushes upon him. In this way, he is similar to the man born blind from today's Gospel. David's family and the blind man's community did not expect the miraculous grace of God's love to work through them. Perhaps they, too, were "blinded" by the expectations and assumptions of those around them. Yet, after being touched by God, they both came to "see" the presence of God's will for them. Both became messengers of God's will. That same Spirit of God's anointing rushed upon us at our baptism; we were given a candle as a sign of our membership in the Body of Christ, the Light from Light. Our vocation, then, is to fulfill that enlightenment, that anointing, as Ephesians tells us, by living as "children of the light."
