### Pastor's Corner



The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph: The gospels are so familiar to us that it is difficult to read or hear them with clarity. The reality of the gospel today is that Joseph, Mary, and Jesus were political refugees. They feared for their lives, as Herod had massacred the Holy Innocents. The Holy Family found safety and refuge in a foreign country. Though Jesus was Emmanuel, danger was present and must have seemed a specter shadowing the Holy Family. We know that Jesus will ultimately lose his life at the hands of the state. Is it any wonder that the gospel message was so popular with the outcast and marginalized? As disciples, let us identify with the outcast, marginalized, and afflicted, for that is what the Holy Family lived. In doing so we will suffer and die in this struggle only to be raised to new life.

-The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God-: Today let us renew our appreciation for Mary (and Joseph) and her role in the life of Jesus, and by extension may we renew our appreciation for all mothers (and fathers) and the role they play in the life of their children. Luke tells us in the gospel, that Jesus “grew and became strong” and he “advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.” This is a good reminder that we can allow ourselves and others to grow in wisdom. None of us has all the answers; we rely on others for advice. The role of a parent is critical in this respect and doesn’t end when we reach adulthood. Let us continue to be open to the influence of others who can help us grow in wisdom and knowledge.

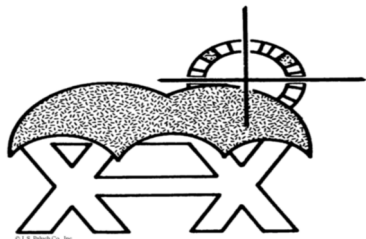

### Winter Weather & Eucharistic Adoration

Thank you to everyone who participates in Eucharistic Adoration; you are a tremendous blessing to our parish!

Winter weather sometimes interrupts regularly scheduled hours of adoration. Generally speaking, if local schools are closed, Adoration is closed that day. If there are winter weather advisories for the evening/night hours Adoration will be closed for those hours. As always, your shift coordinator will make every effort to call you to inform you of these changes. (Please make sure your contact information is correct and current!)

However, if you are not comfortable being out in the winter weather—for whatever reason—even if Adoration is not closed—the please stay home and stay safe. You need to judge your own ability to travel in the weather conditions and act accordingly.

If you have the phone number of the person who follows you in Adoration, call them to let them know you will not be coming in. If you are at Adoration and the next shift person does not arrive, please follow the directions for reposing the host, and feel free to leave. You do not need to stay until someone turns up! Directions are in the sign in book.

If you come in for Adoration and the host has been reposed, and no one else is there, follow the directions for returning the monstrance to the altar. The directions are in the sign in book.
